

GARDEN CLUB

"Change is a beautiful thing," said the butterfly.

Hasn't it been a lovely spring so far? Such a beautiful display of the pinks and whites of the early blossoms: Pear, Crabapple, Plum, Cherry – a veritable fruit bowl. And don't forget the yellow forsythia, the purple, red or white azaleas, lavender wisteria, purple lilac and the white or pink dogwood. "Spring has truly sprung."

Sadly, our plans for a butterfly garden have been temporarily delayed because of the planned pool renovations. When the pool is completed and the area restored, we will continue with those plans.

BUTTERFLIES AND POLLINATORS:

- If you planted your milkweed seeds, you should be seeing nice growth. Keep an eye out for eggs on the leaves. If you have obtained a butterfly cage, you can remove leaves and eggs and place them in a warm sunny place to continue their life cycle or you can contact Lucy Coburn or Carmela Ferraro so they can be transported to someone who will continue their growth.
- The milkweed plant is the only food for the monarch butterfly.
- Hummingbirds are back. Be sure to keep those feeders clean and replace liquid food often.
- No need to remind you to keep those bright colored flowers available to attract pollinators.
- FYI: Apple, almond, and cherry trees are dependent on bee and butterfly pollination. No pollinating, no almonds. As of June 21, summer will officially be here. It's that wonderful time of year for relaxing, enjoying the long days and those beautiful flowers that love the sun. Your Garden Club works to see that our community has its share of those beautiful flowers for all to enjoy.

The following are some familiar and easy to grow suggestions for you to add to your garden which will give you color and attract those butterflies and other pollinators without requiring too much care.

Marigold - It's hard to find a flower that's more cheerful than the classic marigold. Popular with gardeners coast to coast, they are one of the easiest (and most beautiful) annuals to grow. These dense, compact flowers can range in color from pale yellow to deep orange, making a spectacular addition to pots, baskets, and borders or simply scattered throughout the garden. They are a turn-off for deer. Seeds can be planted directly outdoors and will sprout in about one week. They do take a while to reach full bloom, so started plants from your garden center might be a better choice.

Black-eyed Susan - Beloved by pollinators, Black-eyed Susans generally bloom from June to August, displaying their golden-yellow beauty. A deer-resistant wildflower, it can be added anywhere in your garden for a burst of color. They are a self-seeding perennial and will

bloom year after year with little or no care. This can result in the overtaking of other nearby flowers so thin growth accordingly.

Zinnia - In summer, gardening requires plants with three key qualities: Low maintenance (it's hot out there), heat and drought tolerance (ditto), and brilliant color (the brighter the better). Zinnias fit the bill on all three counts, and more. In fact, they're one of the best flowers that smart gardeners can put to work in their gardens. Zinnias are annuals which will provide seed yearly and come in various heights. They are butterfly magnets and one of the best deer resistant flowers you can add to your garden.

Verbena, lantana and hibiscus are some other selections. Check with your local garden center for more suggestions and what works best for you.

There are a myriad of health benefits from gardening, including reducing stress levels, improving mental focus, increasing physical activity and much more ... not to mention sitting back and enjoying the fruits of your labor from attracting pollinators to enjoying a bouquet of cut flowers from your very own garden.

TIPS FOR JUNE GARDENERS:

- Remove spent flowers from annuals, pinch back leggy plants and apply slow-release fertilizer.
- Give a mid-summer application of fertilizer to peonies (be careful if you previously used a time-release fertilizer).
- Clematis and wisteria vines should be trimmed back after they bloom.
- Check roses for black spot and powdery mildew. Treat accordingly.
- Help control mosquitoes: by cleaning birdbaths frequently.

Your Garden Club continues to provide color and beauty to our surroundings. We meet on the second Wednesday of each month. Our next meeting is June 14, in the Lion's Den at 10:30 AM. We'd love to have you join us and consider being a part of this busy group.

SECURITY COMMITTEE

Now that summer is beginning, just a few reminders to enjoy it safely!

Grill safety: According to the National Fire Protection Association, fires caused by outdoor grills and barbecues in the US average about 8,700 per year, not to mention an average of 19,000 patients who go to the emergency room for burns and other grilling related incidents yearly.

Grill location: Place your grill at least 10 feet from your house. Never place it under overhangs, awnings or near trees, tablecloths, lawn decorations, or anything else that could potentially catch fire. Set up your grill on a flat, level surface.

Don't turn on the gas while the grill is closed! Always open up the lid before turning on the propane tank so the gas dissipates on your grill before you light it. If you don't you will create a fireball once you hit the igniter switch and open the lid.

Never leave a grill unattended. Once you start the grill, make sure you can be around to finish the cooking. Remember to keep kids and pets far away from the grill may seem like common sense but if you're entertaining a crowd - it is easy to get distracted.

Clean your grill regularly. Each time you use your grill, clean it before using and ALWAYS clean AFTER you use it. Cleaning away grease and other buildup prevents flare-ups.

Check your grill for problems. It's not uncommon for grills to develop propane leaks or similar problems.

Check all gas lines by placing a little bit of soap water on potential problem spots to check for leaks. If you have a gas leak, it's time to fix or replace your grill.

Be ready to put out a fire. Anytime you're dealing with fire, be prepared to put it out. Keeping a box of baking soda nearby is a good option for putting out a grease fire You can also use a fire extinguisher. Make sure you know how to use it and that it's in working order. If you can't get your fire out, don't hesitate to call 911 for help.

Other gentle reminders, please pick up after your pets, don't litter with cigarette butts and leave plenty of room in front of mailboxes - TREAT YOUR NEIGHBORS THE WAY YOU WANT TO BE TREATED!



- NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY Swim at your own risk.
- 2. All members/residents and guests must sign-in upon entrance to the pool area.
- THUNDER AND LIGHTNING: When thunder occurs, all individuals must leave the pool area. The pool area will be reopened when conditions permit.
- 4. FOR SAFETY REASONS Pool furniture must be kept at least six (6) feet from the edge of the pool.
- Restrooms shall not be used as changing rooms. Dripping bathing suits and bare feet are not allowed in the clubhouse and restroom.
- Atalltimes members/residents and/or guests 16 or over must display numbered plastic badges for admission to the pool area.
- Children 15 or under must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult and must be signed in. No child aged 2-15 will be allowed in the pool between 1pm and 5pm except on Saturdays, when they are allowed in the pool from 12pm - 5pm. Children under the age of 2 are not allowed in the pool at any time. Diapers are not permitted at any age.
- Bathers must wear suitable bathing suits or swim wear. Cut-off pants or jeans are not permitted in the pool.
 - 9. Flotation objects, such as inflatable tubes, kickboards, and flippers, are not permitted in the pool. Styrofoam belts and arm "swimmies" will be permitted in the pool when an adult is in the pool with the child.
 - Diving is not permitted at any time.
 Jumping into the pool is permitted when standing on the edge. Lap lanes must be kept open for lap swimmers.

BAKED CRAB BALLS, Offered by Debbie Hemsath, Maysville, KY. (Friend of LHS)

Ingredients:

1 lb of lump crab meat

1/3 cup of mayo

2 tsp lemon

2 large eggs

2 tsp Old Bay seasoning

1/4 tsp black pepper

Pinch salt

1 tsp parsley

1/2 tsp Tabasco sauce or any hot sauce of your choice 1 cup panko breadcrumbs

* 1 large baking sheet, greased with 1 tsp of olive oil

- 1. Drain the crabmeat well (leaving no water, from pkg)

Architectural Regulations Revision

Replacement Pages - Tear out and replace in Lions Head South Architectural Regulations - Page 3, VI. Application Procedures

Recommendation presented by the Architectural Committee to change required Application Procedures. Motion approved by the Board of Trustees May 8, 2023.

PLEASE NOTE REVISION TO PAGE 3, ARTICLE VI. APPLICATION PROCEDURES TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Unit owners shall obtain one (1) application from the office and return it along with one (1) copy of a sketch (when required) to the office.

Applications shall include details such as the shape, total dimensions, location of the addition/alteration, and materials and colors to be used. The applicant shall sign and date copy.

All proposed additions/alterations shall be compatible with the architectural characteristics of the house, the neighborhood setting, color and construction details.

Applications shall be submitted no later than seven (7) business days before the monthly meeting. Action on applications is usually completed by the tenth of each month. Approved applications shall expire at the end of the calendar year submitted, after which a new application shall be required.

If an application is denied by the Architectural Committee, or if a unit owner disputes an Architectural Committee requirement, he/she may, via written appeal within thirty (30) days, seek a hearing before the Architectural Committee.

If, following the hearing, the Architectural Committee denies the appeal, the unit owner may, via a written appeal within thirty (30) days, seek a hearing before the Board of Trustees. Representatives of the Architectural Committee shall be present at this hearing. The decision of the Board of Trustees shall be final.


