

I hope you are enjoying summer 2021! There is much to be grateful for as our community returns to normalcy and we get to see each other's smiles once again. We hope the work of our club makes you smile as you view the beautiful garden displays around the neighborhood.

We especially wish to point out the garden at the corner of Yorkwood Drive and Lions Head Boulevard South which had been dedicated in 2017 to the memory of our long-time member, Grace Robertson. Grace was a founding member of the Lions Head Garden Club and remained a member until her death. As a member she helped maintain this area for several years and was also a very active member of our community, even serving as a Trustee. Many will remember her serving as a pool monitor for many years. The picture submitted with this article shows our remarkable makeover of that corner which sorely needed it. The trees and shrubs removed were original to that garden and the need to replace the wooden border with the stone was well overdue. It is our hope that the replacement plants will withstand the deer and other animals who loved to snack there! Enjoy this most recent beautification project.

As the summer continues to heat up, it's important to maintain a regular watering schedule. For container plantings, check daily for water needs and pinch back leggy basket plants. Remember to deadhead those flowering plants that require it to ensure you have new flowers all season. Fertilize with a slow-release fertilizer to encourage continued blooming. For garden flowers, water early in the morning when little water is lost to evaporation. A soaker hose around your plantings can reduce water use 25-50%. Prune and fertilize climbing roses after they bloom.

For trees and shrubs, maintain a 3-inch mulch layer around them. It should not be higher and should not touch tree trunks. Make sure your trees receive adequate water as well. Monitor all plants for insect damage. Sunny and very hot weather may add stress.

As reported in last month's Lions Pride Garden Club Article, we are enjoying a growing membership. As always, we wish to welcome anyone in the community who loves gardening or would like to learn more about it. Please join us at our next meeting scheduled on July 14th at 10:30 a.m. in the Clubhouse.

Brick Township offers many events and programs over the summer. Below is a list of events offered during July and August. For further information contact the Brick Recreation Dept. at 732-262-1044 or visit the Brick Township web site at www.bricktownship.net.

July Activities:

Summerfest at Windward Beach Park will be held on Thursdays in July. There will be food trucks, a beer and wine garden, fireworks, and bands. Shuttle buses available in 4 locations in Brick from 6-8 pm going to the park and returning starting at 9 pm. Fireworks start around 9-9:30 pm. The band schedule for Summerfest includes Super Trans Am (July 1), the Amish Outlaws (July 8), The Nerds (July 15) and Tribute to the 80's and 90's (July 22).

As we move into the heat of summer and away from the COVID restrictions of the past year, it is a pleasure to observe the great condition of the golf course. Our Superintendent, Brian Young, has continued with his outstanding level of work maintaining the course. His conscientious attitude and dedicated effort to our course maintenance is readily apparent everywhere you look on the course. We appreciate his efforts and look forward to his continuing to provide our members one of the finest courses in the area to play on.

The initial tree trimming for 2021 wrapped up in June. The trees on the left side of hole 9 were trimmed back, finally giving the ladies a view of the entire 9th green. In the fall we will begin a general clean-up of the roughs, to clear out the downed trees, branches, bushes, etc, that have accumulated over the years. Sand for the refurbishment of the sand traps will be on hand during June/July time frame and the plan is to have them done during July. During this same period, we will get soil to elevate the ladies Tee on hole 5 and start to fill in the low areas on hole 9. With the removal of many diseased trees and beetle infestation. we will start a tree replacement program. Using Rutgers University reforestation program, we will get evergreen seedlings for the long-range tree replacement. In several areas it is required that we purchase more mature trees to ensure we maintain some sort of barrier for errant golf balls. Holes 2 and 5 will have priority for this year and as such we will plant seedlings and mature trees to provide the necessary protection and long-range growth.

To improve the overall appearance of the golf course, Pat Whyte has volunteered to plant and maintain flowers around the course. Her efforts in this area have already produced beautiful results and so far, she has been successful in stopping the deer from eating the flowers. We appreciate your efforts, Pat, and please keep up the good work. Pat also assists our Treasurer, Marjorie Kennedy, in the 20/20 and Free Membership raffles. We are so very fortunate to have the volunteers we have to ensure all of our programs and events are properly controlled and organized. The raffles provide a major portion of our "events" money for the year and are very important to our overall bottom line.

The July Scramble is scheduled for Tuesday, July 13th. Bill Begley has volunteered to set-up, organize and run the scramble. Anyone interested in volunteering, getting involved with any of our many programs and/or events,

please contact me anytime.

Speaking of volunteers, we had a water pipe burst over the winter and between Ed Bischoff and Jay Wiss, it was rapidly repaired and is back in service. Always appreciate the time and effort of our volunteers. Without this type of effort, there is no way we could maintain the course at the level we desire.

A "save the date" Flyer is included with this copy of the Pride for our Annual Golf Tournament, which is scheduled for Saturday, September 25th. We have decided that even though COVID is not the health threat it once was, we are going to remain cautious and run the tournament much the same as last year, keeping it basically low key, minimize gatherings, lunches, etc. We plan on three flights of at least 36 players per flight and starting times of 8:00, 10:00 and 12:00. Registration forms will be available in early August, with a cut-off date of September 12th.

During May we lost one of our long-term supporters, volunteers and past President, Dick Mayer. Through his time, effort and deep involvement in the LHCC, he greatly assisted in building a legacy and a golf operation that we, the current members have and will continue to have, the opportunity to build on. His wife Mena Mayer died in November 2020 and together they served in many capacities to further enhance our operations. Dick was a member of the "Greatest Generation," and served on Iwo Jima as a corpsman with the 5th Marine Division during WWII. We send our deepest sympathy and condolences to his family and friends.

BUILDING & GROUNDS

Because it has been a couple of months since our last article, we would like to catch you up on what is going on with Buildings & Grounds.

It has been an arduous task getting the front entrance pond and fountain done but, hopefully, at this writing, it will be complete. The rainy days of April and the pollen and cherry blossoms shedding in May kept the epoxy paint from getting done. The loose stones surrounding the pond had to be reset. There has been installed a new pump, filter, fountain head, lighting and, of course, the plantings; a big job that took countless man-hours.

You may have noticed several new benches throughout the community. This was a thoughtful gesture from the Board of Trustees since many more residents have taken up walking and biking. Now you have more areas to relax and enjoy the beauty in our community.

Published in the June Pride (page 19) is the list of houses on Lauren Lane and Lions Head Boulevard that are scheduled to be painted in 2021. The painting is limited to original wood trim and original front doors. All wood must be painted white. It is the responsibility of the homeowner to have someone present when exterior painting is done. Inspect the work before signing the completed work form. Once the completed form is signed the painter is not obligated to return.

Please be reminded that if there are any questions or concerns for Turf Masters, please call them directly at the number listed in the Lions Pride: (732) 349-0444.

In addition, for sprinkler issues; fill out form located at the Clubhouse and place in the box at the clubhouse. Sprinkler issues will be investigated in 24-48 hours after submission. Federal Irrigation contact information: (732) 349-9905.

Looking forward, Building and Grounds will continue to monitor our common areas to improve and refurbish. Any resident who would like to participate in this Committee is welcome to attend our meeting held at 10:30 a.m. the first Tuesday of each month.



Here are some tips to avoid phone scams:

- Never send money or gift cards to people you do not know.
- Do not answer the phone for unknown numbers.
- The Social Security Office will never call you.
- The police will never call you and tell you "you have a warrant you must send us money."

The following are common phone scams:

- The "Grandparent Scam:" "Grandpa, it's me! I was drinking and got in an accident. Now I'm calling you from jail and need bail money. Please go to the Western Union office and send me \$2,000 right away! And please don't tell mom; she'll be so disappointed!"
- The "Friend-in-Trouble E-mail Scam:" "This is your friend Tracy, e-mailing from London. John and I got mugged while traveling. We lost everything, and need cash for a flight home! If you wire us the money as soon as possible, I promise we'll pay you back."
- The "Foreign Investor Scam:" "I am a high-ranking person in a foreign country, sending random e-mail to a total stranger. I must transfer funds to an American bank account. Please e-mail your account information to me, and together we will realize great profit!"
- "This is the Health Department, if you send \$100 we will get you in for a vaccine appointment."

How to protect yourself:

- Never give your credit card number, social security number, or other personal information to a telemarketer or an institution you do not know or trust. Never give personal information over the phone, unless you initiated the call and are providing it to a company you know and trust.
- You can sign up for the National Do Not Call Registry at 888-382-1222, or www.donotcall.gov to prevent telemarketers from calling your phone.
- Check your credit occasionally to assure you are not a victim of identity theft. You can obtain one free credit report every 12 months from each of the three credit reporting bureaus: Equifax, Experian and TransUnion. You can call: 877-322-8228 or visit: www.AnnualCreditReport.
- If you believe you have been a victim of a scam please call Brick Police at 732-262-1100 and report the incident. Do not be embarrassed or afraid to report it.

LIONS HEAD SOUTH COVID POOL RULES - 2021

- The Monitor, Board of Trustees, Recreation Committee Members, and the LHSA Administrator have the responsibility and authority to enforce the 2021 Pool Rules. It is the responsibility of the homeowners to comply with these rules.
- 2. Swimming is only allowed when the Monitor is on duty. The Pool Rules must be followed or it could result in removal from the pool area and revocation of pool privileges. NO LIFEGUARD IS ON DUTY. Swim at your own risk.
- 3. Everyone must sign in. When leaving, belongings must also be removed.
- 4. Saving of space will not be permitted.
- 5. Resident Pool Badges are required for admittance.
- 6. **RESIDENTS ONLY.** No guests or children will be allowed admittance to the pool area.
- 7. For safety purposes, there will be no sitting on the stairs or ladders.
- 8. Only non-alcoholic beverages, in plastic or aluminum container, is permitted in pool area. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- 9. Snacks, in single serve "containers, are" allowed in the pool area. Food should not be shared with non-household members. All residents are responsible for cleaning their own area after eating. Picnic tables will be provided outside of the pool fence for anyone having sandwiches, subs or pizza, etc.
- 10. NJ Health regulations require showering before entering the pool.
- 11. Smoking is not allowed in the fenced-in pool area. Designated smoking areas, at the end of the sidewalk by the parking lot, must be used. Dispose of cigarette butts and other garbage appropriately.
- 12. Residents must wear appropriate swimwear in the pool; cut-off pants or jeans are not permitted.
- 13. Floatation devices are not permitted. Personal noodles, will be permitted, but must be removed upon leaving the pool area for the day.
- 14. No diving is permitted. No sports, including ball playing or horseplay, are permitted.
- 15. Pets are prohibited in the pool area.
- 16. The season will start on Monday June 21, 2021 and will extend through Sunday September 12, 2021, tentatively. Pool hours will be from 11:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. daily.
- 17. All pool complaints or concerns regarding pool rules or non-conformance of duties by the Monitor must be reported in writing to the LHSA Administrator.

These rules are a protection of your rights, not a restriction of your rights, and are presented to ensure your safety and enjoyment of the community. Your neighborly courtesy is appreciated. These rules shall remain in effect unless changed or superseded by the LHSA Board of Trustees. These rules may be amended by the CDC and the NJ Board of Health.

BYLAWS COMMITTEE Vol. 1, No. 3



Bylaws Basics is a periodical publication of the LHS Bylaws Committee

The purpose of this document is, hopefully, to simplify the understanding of the Bylaws that govern us here at Lions Head South (LHS).

OPINION (along with a few facts:)

Recently, the Association's attorneys advised our Trustees to recommend a Tort Amendment to our ByLaws. The Trustees tasked the Bylaws Committee to present information on this proposed amendment to the community and conduct a vote on the matter. As you are aware, letters of intent explaining this amendment were distributed to all homeowners, information was published in The Pride and subsequently ballots were mailed out on this important issue.

State of New Jersey statutes require that 2/3 of the members of our community must vote in favor of such an amendment for it to be adopted. That means with 615 homes there must be 410 votes in favor.

The deadline for receipt of the ballots was 12 noon on May 21, 2021. At 1:00 pm on that date the ByLaws Committee opened and tallied the votes. This was witnessed by 3 of our Trustees. Unfortunately only 403 valid ballots were returned. Of these, 292 voted in favor of the amendment with 111 against it. Those 292 Yes votes fell far below the required 410 votes required for approval. However, of the 403 votes, that 292 represents 72% in favor. If at least 600 of our homeowners had shown more interest in this issue, you *could* factor out that 72% to an approval count of 432 (more than enough for approval).

Volunteers worked diligently to complete this task; it is disappointing that more members of the community did not exercise their privilege to vote and have an active say in the running of Lions Head South.

Now, the ByLaws Committee can get down to our original task of reviewing the ByLaws for any necessary changes for the benefit of Lions Head South and those who care. We do!
