



GARDEN CLUB

We hope you have been enjoying our work in the community. Our club has been in full swing as our plantings have been done in time for the opening of our pool. Our watering team is in place and you may see them out and about maintaining our plantings. The Garden Club meets monthly with the exception of December, January and February but as you can see we are very busy all other months with our planning and garden work.

As many of you plant your own gardens and pots, the month of July is when you should be checking your containers and hanging baskets daily for water needs. Try to water early in the morning when little water is lost to evaporation. Soaker hoses reduce water use by 25-50%. Pinch back leggy basket plants. Apply a slow release fertilizer to encourage annuals to continue blooming. Temperatures above 86 degrees will create stress in most plants. Check for insect damage at this time as well.

And speaking of insects, who hasn't noticed the numerous ant hills in every crack in the sidewalk and in our lawns as well?

Believe it or not, ants are a very important part of the ecosystem of the garden. Ants tunneling in the ground help to aerate the soil to allow moisture and oxygen to get to plant roots. They also speed up the decomposition of decaying plant matter which further helps to fertilize plants. Common species of ants feed on moth eggs and larvae. Gardeners who promote biodiversity and introduce beneficial insects can reduce the number of garden pests naturally.

If you aren't sold on the good qualities of ants and would still like to rid your property of them, consider the following:

A mixture of borax and sugar is an effective way to control ants in the garden. Mix half a cup of sugar and one and a half tablespoons of borax with one and a half cups of warm water. Soak cotton balls in the sugary ant bait and put them where ants are in your garden.

You could try using cornmeal to bait and kill ants in your garden. For cornmeal to be an effective ant bait, you should mix it with borax. Mix nine parts boric acid and one part of cornmeal. Add some vegetable oil to make a smooth paste. Put in a plastic bottle, punch some holes, and place it where you see ant activity. Soon your bottle will be full of dead ants.

Vinegar is another way to eliminate ant infestations from your garden. Combine equal parts of white vinegar and water and fill a spray bottle. You can spray the vinegar solution directly on ants to kill them on contact. Unfortunately, trying to rid your garden of ants by spraying them can be very time-consuming and, ultimately, ineffective.

Pouring boiling water directly on ant nests will kill most of the ants in the colony. If you notice an ant hill, you should rake the soil away. Then pour plenty of boiling water into the nest. Hopefully, you can kill most of the ants, including the queen. Of course, you should be careful handling boiling water.

There are a few things to keep in mind when using boiling water to kill ants:

- Don't use boiling water to get rid of ants in lawns as you will scorch the grass. You can try using copious amounts of cold water to disrupt the ants' habitat.
- Boiling water may not effectively eradicate ants from yards if the nest is under a paving slab.

As always, we encourage interested residents to join us on the second Wednesday of each month in the clubhouse at 10:30 a.m. By the time you read this, we will have already enjoyed our spring luncheon at Manera's. So, as you can see, we have some fun in addition to our work!



Happy summer! With the warmer weather, just a few tips to keep residents and their homes safe:

*Keep the doors locked: It's normal to let our guard down, especially when living in a safe neighborhood – but residents should remember that crime knows no bounds. All doors that lead outside should be locked at all times, day and night - even if you are inside watching TV or outside doing yard work.

*Shut the blinds whenever possible: Many burglars will look through windows of homes they're interested in robbing. Cutting off their visibility into the home can discourage them from proceeding and also keeps your home cooler during those hot summer days.

*Don't advertise travel plans or if you are hospitalized: Residents should do their best to keep any travel plans, whether short-term or extended, to themselves or just a few trusted people (e.g., neighbors and family). Talking about travel publicly or posting about it on social media is a no-no. Even bragging to the bank teller about travel plans should be avoided - you never know who is listening! Also, make sure to have your newspaper and



mail stopped or have a neighbor get them for you. Nothing tips off a burglar more that the owner is away, either on vacation or in the hospital than seeing multiple papers in a driveway or a full mailbox.

*Keep personal information in a safe place: In the event that a home is broken into, the last thing you want is for the burglar to get ahold of personal information. Keep any passports, birth certificates, financial statements, and other sensitive documents in a locked safe or better yet, a safe deposit box.

GENTLE REMINDERS

That apply to residents and visitors alike:

*Dog waste MUST be picked up and disposed of properly (Town ordinance)

*Cigarette butts are considered litter and need to be disposed of properly (Town ordinance)

*Vehicles CANNOT block sidewalks (Town ordinance)

*Vehicles need to be parked faced in the direction of traffic (Town ordinance)

*No parking of vehicles on lawns (Community Rules/ Regulations)

*Visitors/guests are NOT allowed to use Fitness Room. It is for RESIDENTS ONLY (Community Rules/ Regulations)

*If you SEE something - SAY something. The nonemergency phone number is 732-262-1100.



Summer greetings to all our LHS residents.





"BRING ON THE BBO ADD ON THE SIDES"

A "GAZILLION and 1 YEARS AGO", meats and vegetables were marinated, spiced and sauced and cooked over a smokey "FIRE"! The Caribbeans are credited with the style of Barbacoa, known to modern day cooking as Barbecue. The style of racking meats over a smokey fire was used to preserve foods from spoiling. The process of BBQ evolved through many areas of Europe, Africa and Southern United States. Polynesian regions also had a style of BBQ in early times. Numerous variations of BBQ techniques have been mastered through the years, based on individuals' knowledge and palate. Today's modern "BACK YARD BBQ" would not be complete without the addition of side dishes.

Here are some suggestions from our LHS friends & neighbors:

Zucchini Fries - from the recipe box of Barbara Sosinski **Ingredients:**

- 3 zucchinis, cut into the shape of french fries
- 1 cup Panko
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese
- 2 tbsps. Italian seasoning
- 2 eggs beaten

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 450° & line a baking sheet pan
- 2. Season cut pieces with salt
- 3. Mix Panko crumbs, Parmesan cheese & Italian seasoning
- 4. Dip zucchini pcs. into beaten eggs & press in crumbs to cover completely.
- 5. Place on baking sheet, single layer & bake for 15 mins. SERVE with Chunky Blue Cheese Dressing!

SUMMERTIME SALAD - from the recipe box of Sue Auer

Ingredients:

- 2 fresh corn cobs slice corn from cob
- 1 red onion sliced thin
- 1 cup grape tomatoes
- 1 small head of broccoli, steamed
- 1/2 cup sliced black olives

Directions:

- 1. In a salad bowl, layer all the vegetables & olives
- 2. Season with salt & pepper
- 3. Add DRESSING, to salad bowl with veggies & toss

Dressing:

1/4 cup EVOO

2 tbsp lemon juice

1 tbsp fresh mint minced

1/2 tsp black pepper

<u>Grilled Mushrooms & Peppers</u> - from the recipe box of Judy Smugular (LHS friend)

Ingredients:

- 2 colorful peppers sliced into 8 pcs.
- 1 large pkg. baby bella mushrooms; slice each in half
- 3 green onions, trimmed
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tbsp lemon juice
- 2 tsp capers drained & chopped
- 1 tbsp fresh minced parsley

Directions:

- 1. In a large bowl, place first 3 ingredients
- 2. Add to bowl, next 5 ingredients & toss
- 3. Preheat grill to med/high, placing in a veggie grill pan to heat (a pan with holes)
- 4. Add seasoned mushroom & pepper slices to the heated grill pan & turn several times with a grill tong to avoid burning. Grill for approx. 5 - 7 mins.

Grilled Fruits - from the recipe box Mary (Marie) Sino **Ingredients:**

- 3 med peaches, pitted & cut into halves (making 6 pcs.) 1/2 fresh pineapple, peeled & cut into 6 chunks
- 1 tbsp sugar
- 2 tbsp melted butter
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 3 mint leaves

Directions:

- 1. Place peaches & pineapple in large bowl
- 2. Add butter, cinnamon & sugar, toss well
- 3. Skewer the fruits & grill on high for 4 minutes, rotating
- 4. Place on serving platter & dress with mint leaves
