

What a difference a year makes! In May and June 2020, we could not enjoy Mother's or Father's Day with our children and grandchildren. Many of us were disappointed because we could not celebrate our grandchild's college or high school graduation. The enjoyment of so many special occasions that we previously took for granted were taken away from us. Thankfully in 2021, as more venues are open to us, we can celebrate these special events with our children and grandchildren.

In the month of June, we honor the American Flag and our fathers and grandfathers. I want to share with you a little piece of flag trivia: In the 1950s, when it seemed certain that Alaska would be admitted to the Union, designers began retooling the American flag to add a 49th star to the existing 48. Meanwhile, a 17-year-old Ohio student named Bob Heft borrowed his mother's sewing machine, disassembled his family's 48-star flag and stitched on 50 stars in a proportional pattern. He handed in his creation to his history teacher for a class project, explaining that he expected Hawaii would soon achieve statehood as well. Heft also sent the flag to his congressman, Walter Moeller, who presented it to President Eisenhower after both new states joined the Union. Eisenhower selected Heft's design, and on July 4, 1960, the president and the high school student stood together as the 50-star flag was raised for the first time. Heft's teacher promptly changed his grade from a B-to an A.

You may also have noticed the work being done at our entrance. Again, the Garden Club was asked by the Building and Grounds Committee for their input. Clare Mathiasen, Mel Ferraro and Debbie Gehringer met on-site with the chair of the committee and offered suggestions.

Happily, our numbers are increasing. Since 2020, we have gained the following 7 members, bringing our total to 22 -- the most in several years.

From Bridgewater, Maryann Evon came to our community 2 years ago. She likes all plants and appreciates the activities of the Garden Club.

In October of 2020, Christine Kovaly joined us in LHS from a large area in Farmingdale and adores gardening.

We are happy to welcome these enthusiastic members and look forward to working with them.

"The fattest and most scrumptious of all flowers, a rare fusion of fluff and majesty, the peony is now coming into bloom." – Henry Mitchell, American writer

A flower we have not spent much time on, peonies are perennials that come back every year to take your breath away. In fact, the plants may live longer than you do—some have been known to thrive for at least 100 years. Wow, maybe we should have mentioned these before. They do not transplant well. It is best done in the fall. Plant in deep, rich, moist soil that drains well with a neutral Ph. Deadhead after blooming, cutting to a strong leaf. In fall cut to the ground and mulch lightly. Remove mulch in spring. One other important fact—they are deer resistant. Much more information on peonies can be found on-line.

TIPS FOR JUNE GARDENERS

- Check all plants daily, especially those in planters, for water needs. Water in the mornings and use mulch to prevent evaporation in gardens.
- Remove spent flowers from annuals, pinch back leggy plants and apply a slow-release fertilizer.
- It is also time to give a mid-summer application of fertilizer to peonies (be careful if you previously used a time-release fertilizer).
- Clematis and wisteria vines should be trimmed back after they bloom.
- Check roses for black spot and powdery mildew. Treat accordingly. Pick off Japanese beetles by hand and drown them in soapy water.
- Remember, to help control mosquitoes: clean birdbaths frequently and check for standing water. Female mosquitoes need only a teaspoon of water to deposit their eggs.

We meet the second Wednesday of each month. Our next meeting is June 9th, at 10:30 AM in the Lion's Den. Won't you join us?

LIONS HEAD SOUTH COVID POOL RULES - 2021

- The Monitor, Board of Trustees, Recreation Committee Members, and the LHSA Administrator have the responsibility and authority to enforce the 2021 Pool Rules. It is the responsibility of the homeowners to comply with these rules.
- Swimming is only allowed when the Monitor is on duty. The Pool Rules must be followed or it could result in removal from the pool area and revocation of pool privileges.
 NO LIFEGUARD IS ON DUTY. Swim at your own risk.
- 3. Everyone must sign in. When leaving, belongings must also be removed.
- Saving of space will not be permitted.
- Resident Pool Badges are required for admittance.
- 6. RESIDENTS ONLY. No guests or children will be allowed admittance to the pool area.
- 7. For safety purposes, there will be no sitting on the stairs or ladders.
- 8. Only non-alcoholic beverages, in plastic or aluminum container, is permitted in pool area. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- Snacks, in single serve "containers, are" allowed in the pool area. Food should not be Shared with non-household members. All residents are responsible for cleaning their own area after eating. Picnic tables will be provided outside of the pool fence for anyone having sandwiches, subs or pizza, etc.
- 10. NJ Health regulations require showering before entering the pool.
- 11. Smoking is not allowed in the fenced-in pool area. Designated smoking areas, at the end of the sidewalk by the parking lot, must be used. Dispose of cigarette butts and other garbage appropriately.
- Residents must wear appropriate swimwear in the pool; cut-off pants or jeans are not permitted.
- 13. Flotation devices, including "noodles", are not permitted.
- 14. No diving is permitted. No sports, including ball playing or horseplay, are permitted.
- 15. Pets are prohibited in the pool area.
- The season will start on Monday June 21, 2021 and will extend through Sunday September 12, 2021, tentatively. Pool hours will be from 11:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. daily.
- 17. All pool complaints or concerns regarding pool rules or non-conformance of duties by the Monitor must be reported in writing to the LHSA Administrator.

#3 - June 4th is "NATIONAL CHEESE DAY".

Cheese theories have been recorded since 8000BC. Early cheese making in Central Asia, Europe and the Middle East have produced some of the finest. Here are some very interesting & fun recipes offered by some of our neighbors, relatives & friends.... who happen to be cheese LOVERS!

Marie Militello offered this GREAT "Ricotta cheese croquettes" recipe...

Ingredients:

1 lb. ricotta cheese -

1 tbsp. grated Romano cheese

1 egg

2-3 sprigs of chopped parsley

1/2 tsp. salt & pepper

1 cup bread crumbs for coating

1/4 cup oil

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. In a large bowl combine cheese, egg, parsley, S&P. Mix until thickens.
- 2. Shape into 12 oval croquettes.
- 3. Roll each croquette in breadcrumbs, until coated. Roll more than once.
- 4. Fry in heated oil, until golden brown. Drain on paper towel.

Jeanine Brunas, sister-in-Law...of Sue A. "Feta Stuffed Zucchini Blossoms"... stuffing fun with the grandchildren.

Ingredients:

12 Zucchini blossoms

2 oz. of crumbled Feta cheese

2 med tomatoes diced small

2 tbsp. fresh chopped basil

1/2 tsp. black pepper or to taste

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

4 oz. of Prosecco

1/2 cup olive oil

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. In a large bowl mix Feta cheese, chopped tomatoes, basil & season with S& P.
- 2. Let mixture sit for 15 minutes. Drain any liquid that forms.
- 3. In 2nd bowl, mix flour & Prosecco for coating batter. (consistency of heavy cream).
- 4. Open each blossom; rinse and dry inside with paper towel.

- 5. SPOON (1 med- large) of cheese mixture into the blossom. Close opening tightly.
- 6. Dip each flower into coating batter.
- 7. Drop & Fry in heated olive oil. Drain on paper towel.

Butch Wood... lover of Parmesan cheese "Pacific Seafood" with less fat & calories than most

Ingredients:

1 16oz pkg. of fettuccine noodles

1 1/2 tbsp. butter or margarine

1 cup chopped green onions

4 garlic cloves, peeled & minced

1 lb. each shrimp, sea scallops (or any seafood of choice, crab, lobster etc.)

2 cups half & half cream

1 cup grated parmesan cheese

S&P to taste.

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add pasta & cook for 8-10 minutes. Or al dente & drain.
- 2. Melt butter in a large, nonstick skillet over med heat.
- 3. Stir in onions & garlic. Cook for 1 minute, add shrimp & scallops. Stirring to combine 3 minutes... reduce heat to low.
- 4. Pour half & half, S&P into the skillet; bring to a simmer. DO NOT BOIL. Stirring constantly. Sprinkle 1/2 cup parmesan cheese over seafood mixture and remove from heat.
- 5. Toss pasta into pan, coating all the pasta & sprinkle remaining cheese on top and serve.

Sue Auer... from my recipe box...! CHEDDAR CHESSE BITES

Ingredients:

1/2 box of Triscuits – crushed

3 eggs - in separate bowl- whisk eggs

Filling ingredients:

2 cups shredded cheddar cheese

8 oz. cream cheese

1/4 cup of sour cream

1/8 cup chopped dill

1/8 cup chopped green onions

1 garlic clove, peeled & minced

1 tbsp. (1/2 lemon) juice

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Combine all filling ingredients in a large bowl.
- 2. Pinch off bite size portions of mixture & roll into ball shape.
- 3. Roll into egg wash, then crushed Triscuits.
- 4. Fry in vegetable oil until light brown.
- 5. DO NOT OVER FRY, AS THE CHEESE WILL POUR OUT OF BREADING.
- 6. Garnish with lemon juice & chopped dill.

The purpose of this document is, hopefully, to simplify the understanding of the Bylaws that govern us here at Lions Head South (LHS).


This past month (April 2021) a proposed ByLaws amendment concerning Tort Immunity was presented to the community for a vote. Basically, this amendment was aimed at protecting OUR Association from frivolous suits. Some comments were made at the May 3 Resident's Meeting that voting for this amendment would deny residents the right to sue for wrongful acts by the Association. That is not the case, as outlined in the proposed amendment. It does not protect the Association from negligence. Let's face it, if suits are allowed, regardless of their validity, we, the Association of LHS would still have to defend them at considerable expense due to attorney's and court fees as experienced in our past history.

If this proposed amendment did not pass (at this writing the votes are probably already in), and a suit is presented, we are basically *suing ourselves*, as any funds to pay off a successful claim come from OUR treasury and could possibly affect our HOA fees.

Regardless of the outcome, we would like to thank all residents for taking the time to review this issue and submit their vote.

PLEASE NOTE REVISION TO 3.4 FUND ACCOUNTABILITY 3.4.7. TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

3.4.7. The Council shall insure that all monies collected from any of its committees, including but not limited to: social, travel, bocce, outdoor shuffleboard and men's and women's indoor shuffleboard, be deposited into the Activities Coordinating Council checking account.

The balance of net profits from the Social and Travel committees shall be passed through the Activities Coordinating Council checking account to the Association for deposit into the Capital Improvement Account to fund - or partially fund -Special Association social events to which all Association members are invited. Such expenditures shall be approved by the Board of Trustees. All other monies deposited into the Activities Coordinating Council checking account shall be held in escrow until requested by a group at the end of their season.
