

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings all:

I am writing this message after the Board of Trustees has just met with our accountant and afterward finalized the budget for fiscal year 2024.

In the August edition of the Pride I wrote that no increase in the maintenance fee would be necessary in association with the pool. That is true as the payments for the pool will come from our operating account. That means it is a budgetary expense paid in the normal course of business.

Now, the accountant has been telling the Board for many years that we need to put hundreds of thousands of dollars into our reserve account. The reserve account pays for things that require fixing or replacing. We are mandated to provide reserves for the future. We have fallen short in this reserve account because we haven't had enough funds to place into this account and the cost of living and inflation is kicking us all in the butt. As I'm sure you are all aware we have had only two increases in our maintenance fees since the early 2000's totaling \$20. As a result, we have the awful task of raising the maintenance fee to \$165 for the year 2024. We will present the budget during our residents meeting in December. We urge you to attend as we present the numbers.

That being said, we, the Board, hope your Thanksgiving was wonderful and look forward to a joyous Christmas and Chanukah and a Happy New Year.

GARDEN CLUB

Well, here we are again in the hustle and bustle of the holiday season. At this writing, fall has been comfortably cool, blustery and rainy. Hopefully this is not a sign of a bad winter. We can only wait and hope.

Our Fall luncheon was delightful. At Tuscany, all enjoyed a day of fine food with good friends. Thank you, Lucy Coburn and Diane Chapin for arranging this lovely day.

By now your gardens should be cleaned of debris and dead plants, sprinkled with Preen (to limit weed growth in the spring) and covered with mulch. Containers should be cleaned and set aside from the weather. Now sit back and relax till after the holidays when it will be time to enjoy all those colorful seed catalogues and start planning for 2024.

Hate those spiders and insects during the winter months? Instead of using potentially harmful chemical repellents, try using some common plants that insects can't stand. If you've got an insect that's bothering you, the right combination of herbs, flowers or leafy vegetation could offer a little relief. Following are some popular choices:

- Lavender Pleasant smell, repels moths, fleas, flies and mosquitoes
- Peppermint Minty-fresh smell that insects hate
- Basil It's smells and oils help repel bugs. Good in cooking too!
- Carnivorous Venus Fly Traps A good way to lure bugs to their doom
- Sage and Rosemary can be dried and put in sachet bags for your clothes drawers.

Burnt coffee grounds can also act as a deterrent for some bugs and insects; however, they should be used wisely and as part of a broader approach to pest control. More info for using coffee grinds as an insect repellent and fertilizer can be found on-line.

While speaking with several members of the community, it has come to my attention that many are unaware of why the garden at the corner of Yorkwood Drive has been dedicated to the memory of Grace Robertson. With that in mind, I am providing the following information for the benefit of those who did not know Grace, or those who may have forgotten the reason for dedicating this garden to her.



Grace was a founding member of the Lion's Head South Garden Club, which began as a small group of men and women joining together to provide a little beauty in the community. There was no assistance, financial or physical, and they often paid for their needed supplies. Gradually the group became a part of the Building and Grounds Committee.

Grace was proud to be a Garden Club member and remained so until her death. She said, "It provides a valuable service to the community while creating beautiful areas for all to enjoy." She credited her love of gardening to her grandmother who always had a beautiful flower garden.

She was described as a "professional volunteer" and it is easy to see why. Her yearbook described her as a "joiner". She was active in Girl Scouts, serving as head of the Greater Essex Girl Scouts and continued this association for 56 years. Locally, she was a member of the Order of Evergreen Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore.

She and her husband arrived in Lions Head South in 1987 from North Caldwell where they lived for 39 years. They had 2 daughters.

Throughout her stay in Lions Head South, she was an active community member serving in numerous ways including the Board of Trustees as both President and Vice President. One of her favorite activities was serving as a pool monitor where she could be seen at the pool entrance greeting and chatting with friends and members of the community. If that's not enough, she also played Bocce and Indoor Shuffleboard. Among her other activities, Grace was in charge of our watering schedule for many years and she also regularly tended the Yorkwood garden.


On the occasion of her 92nd birthday she credited her longevity to her genes as her parents and grandparents lived to their 90s.

A trendsetter, she was the epitome of volunteerism and set a great example for us all. We are fortunate to have had her as a member.

Please Tear out and Place in the Lions Head South By-Laws Architectural Regulations

Page 1, II. Restrictions on Common Property Uses. Page 14, XV. Exterior Storage of Trash or Supplies

Recommendations presented by the Architectural Committee to include additions/revisions to Restrictions on Common Property Uses and Exterior Storage of Trash or Supplies.

Motion approved by the Board of Trustees August 28, 2023.

PLEASE NOTE ADDITIONAL REVISION TO PAGE 1, II. RESTRICTIONS ON COMMON GROUND, PARAGRAGH 7 TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Vegetable gardens shall be limited to the three-foot wide rear foundation planting area of the house or side from the rear of the air conditioning unit to the rear of the house or an equivalent area on the opposite side of the house. Tree plantings may be protected with green vinyl coated landscaping type fencing, specifically designed to protect plants. It may be placed around new plantings, during their first year of planting. It may not exceed three (3) feet in height and must be removed by May 1 of the year following the planting. No chicken wire or construction fencing may be used.

Lions Head South Architectural Regulations Page 14, XV. Exterior Storage Deck Box andUpright Garden/Storage Container. Replaces 2nd Paragraph.

One (1) small deck box, no larger than six (6) feet in length, thirty-six (36) inches in height and thirty-six (36) inches deep, with a top hinged lid only, may be placed behind the air conditioner on either side of the house, but not on the street side if a corner property. It may also be placed on the rear patio at the rear of the house. In addition, one (1) upright storage/garden container, measuring no larger than six (6) feet in height, three (3) feet wide and two (2) feet deep may be stored on the rear patio. A maximum of two (2) units (one of each) maybe placed on each property. The storage units may not be made of wood and must be constructed of man-made materials. It must be stand-alone and may not be attached to the house. The color must blend in with the existing color of the house. Prior approval of the size, color and location of the storage unit (s) is required by the Architectural Committee.

A complete dinner finishes with a **SWEET**! Through the centuries, dessert became **TREATS** made with fruits, jams, marzipan and so many other ingredients. They were crafted into numerous decorative designs, such as cakes, cookies, puddings, pastries, dips (just to mention a few) and in various shapes, sizes & colors!

Our friends offered some of their favorites for the DECEMBER HOLIDAYS!

CINNAMON STREUSEL BUNDT CAKE - by Cheri Parker

Had this yummy cake at a MAHJONG get-together ... OUTSTANDINGLY GREAT!

Ingredients:

for Streusel topping 1 cup flour 1 cup light brown sugar - firmly packed 1 tbsp cinnamon

1/2 cup of butter - 1 stick

1 cup pecans - chopped

for cake

- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup butter softened
- 2 cups sugar

2/3 cups sugar 2/3 cups sour cream

4 eggs

- 1 tbsp vanilla 2 cups flour
- 1/4 tsp baking soda
- 1/4 tsp baking soda

Directions:

- for Streusel topping
 - 1. Preheat oven to 325°
 - 2. Mix flour, brown sugar& cinnamon in a bowl

3. Cut in cold butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbles & set aside

for Cake

- 1. Beat soften butter, sugar & sour cream in a large bowl with electric mixer on med. speed, until light & fluffy
- 2. Add eggs 1 at a time, beat after each addition, then add in vanilla
- 3. Gradually add in flour & baking soda until well mixed
- 4. Spoon 1/2 of streusel topping into greased & floured 12 cup BUNDT pan
- 5. Spoon 1/2 of batter over the topping, then REPEAT layers

- 6. Bake 1hr or until toothpick inserted comes out clean
- 7. Cool completely on wire rack.
- 8. Sprinkle with confectioner's sugar or drizzle Vanilla Glaze, if desired

SIMPLE Vanilla Glaze: In med. bowl, Mix 1 1/2 cups of 10X sugar, 2 tbsp PURE vanilla extract ... until smooth. If necessary, stir in 1-3 additional tsps. of water until desired consistency of glaze

*******OPTION FOR CAKE:** Prepare cake bake as directed, stir in 1 cup of chopped peeled apples****

PECAN PRALINE COOKIES - by Carol Brower. Thank You Carol, some of your FINEST are always **MAGICAL!**

Ingredients:

- 1 1/4 cups pecans
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 tsps corn starch
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1 cup (2 sticks) butter melted & cooled slightly
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar1 cup packed dark brown sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 tbsp vanilla extract

Directions:

- 1. In a med. skillet toast the pecans on med. 3-5 mins. just till fragrant, stirring frequently. Put in bowl & cool completely. Then coarsely chop
- 2. In med bowl whisk together, flour, baking soda, corn starch & salt
- 3. In a large bowl, beat butter & both sugars on med. 2-3 min until light & fluffy. Reduce speed to low & add in egg & vanilla
- 4. Scrap down the bowl & beat in flour mixture on low speed until combined
- 5. Fold in pecans. Cover & refrigerate for 2 hrs.
- 6. Preheat oven to 350°. Line cookie sheet with parchment paper. Place ONE heaping tsp. of dough 2" apart. Bake 9-11 mins. until edges are JUST TURNING brown. Cool on rack for 5 mins.

"**RAISIN RICE PUDDING**" - Pudding couldn't be so simple, easy & quick, found online & offered by Irene Lewer, former executive chef!

Ingredients:

- 1 cup of minute rice uncooked
- 3 cups of whole milk
- 1 cup of raisins (dark or light)
- 1 pkg. INSTANT vanilla pudding
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon

1/4 tsp nutmeg

- 2 tbsp butter
- 1/3 cup sugar 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup pecans or walnuts

Directions:

1st:

- 1. In med. saucepan bring 1 cup of milk to a boil
- 2. Stir in rice, raisins, cinnamon, nutmeg, butter, sugar, salt & vanilla extract
- 3. Cover & reduce heat to low & simmer 5 -7 mins. Remove from heat

2nd:

- 1. In med. bowl combine 2 cups milk with INSTANT vanilla pudding & mix well.
- 2. Add rice mixture to pudding
- 3. Stir in nuts
- 4. Cover with plastic. Serve cold or warm garnish with cherry!

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PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2023-2024 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a **physician script/note** which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician.

Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal. The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

ALWAYS CALL 911 FOR ANY MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Please be sure to keep on hand extra supplies of medications and food so that you do not need to leave the house during or immediately after a snowstorm. The weather predications generally provide ample warning time for making preparations.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician.

Please respond as soon as possible as the winter season will be here soon.


