

LET'S TALK HOUSE PLANTS:

Have you noticed, what we call fruit flies or no-seeums, in the house? These may very well be fungus gnats emanating from your houseplants. Although fungus gnat adults are more of a nuisance than a pest, the immature stage (larvae) feeds on plant roots and can cause growth problems, especially on young plants. Fungus gnats are often a symptom of over watering,

How to detect a fungus gnat problem is simple. They may fly up when watering or tap the soil to see if they emerge. They are drawn to moist potting soil and decaying leaves on the surface of the soil around your plants. Act as soon as you spot gnats in your houseplants. While it may be tempting to spray the adult fungus gnats, that's usually just a short-term fix because more adults will appear from the larvae in the soil.

There are a couple of methods you can try to rid your plants of these pests:

• Avoid over watering your houseplants and make sure they have good drainage. Allow the soil to dry between regular watering, not to the point that your plant begins eggs and larvae usually die in dry soil. Remember to drain any excess water that accumulates in saucers, too.

wilting but enough that the soil isn't always moist. The

• If you feel the roots are infested with any type of pest, soak your plants, planter, leaves and all, in a bucket with a solution of insecticidal soap and water (1 tsp of soap per liter of water, or follow the instructions on the bottle) for about 15-20 minutes. Skim debris off the top of the water with your plant submerged beneath to keep them clean when you take them out. Once they're done soaking, take them out, rinse them off and clean the planter pot to your satisfaction. Set out some towels and let them drain all the excess water. Make sure to allow the soil to completely dry before watering them again!

I have found Neem Oil in a concentrate works well and for plants that are too large to submerge, soak as much of the plant as possible and use a Neem Oil spray on the un-submerged areas.

Nine Must-Know Tips for Houseplant Care in the Winter:

- (1) Cut back on watering.
- (2) Pay attention to sunlight.
- (3) Don't worry about a few dropped leaves.
- (4) Avoid temperature extremes.
- (5) Pause the fertilizer.
- (6) Patrol for houseplant pests.
- (7) Up the humidity.
- (8) Keep foliage clean.
- (9) Resist repotting wait until Spring



Special thanks and appreciation to our Superintendent, Dave Moniz for the outstanding condition of the course. Through his dedicated effort and conscientious work ethic our course was playable and beautiful in every respect throughout 2022. We look forward to his continued presence and high maintenance standards now and as far into the future as is possible. The course has never looked better, it is superbly maintained and playable even as we get into the colder weather. In response to his efforts and conscientious approach to the course maintenance we gave Dave a letter of appreciation, which was sent to his company, Bright View, to let them know how well he performed this year. In addition to the letter our members collected a generous donation for Dave to show our gratitude and appreciation for his hard work and the outstanding results he has produced on the golf course.

Any LHCC members interested in participating in the Starter Program for 2023, please contact me at the LHCC Clubhouse. To maintain the day-to-day operations of the golf course we need approximately 15 Starters. Volunteer if you can, this program has proven its value and worth through the growth in membership and income. The Starters provide a person to readily sell the attributes of the course to guest, interested individuals and or new residents of LHS/LHN. We need your assistance to continue the growth we have been experiencing over the last four years. Our membership has gone from less than 80 to over 130 members and our income increased from below \$50,000.00 a year to over \$65,000.00 this year. We have not reached our goal nor our full potential in members or income, but the Starter Program gives us an opportunity to continue this growth.

Talking about volunteering, please take the time to think about being involved with the golf course operation, maybe as a member of the Board of Directors, or assist in anyone of the many events put on by the LHCC or maybe just caring enough to show up at one or all of the four scheduled General Membership Meetings. By the way, these General Membership Meeting are put on by the Board of Directors to keep members informed on the overall operation of the course, status of improvements, future plans and activities

as well as to elect new members to the Board of Directors so that we can continue to serve you. Case in point, of the last four General Membership Meetings, meetings are held quarterly, not one had a quorum, resulting in the last two Directors being temporarily appointed while pending a meeting with a quorum. This is OUR golf course, run by us for our mutual enjoyment of a great place to play golf, participate, get involved, it is run best when the majority are actively supporting the operation. For anyone interested we are in dire need of a volunteer to serve as our VP, this is a key position perhaps leading someone to step up as our next President.

During November we had 17 trees and bushes planted and anticipate planting a similar number in the Spring of 2023. This is the start of our Reforestation Program and we are aligning it with our desire to enhance the beauty of the entire course by adding flowering trees to give us the necessary color to really make this a place of year around beauty. Also in November, three pallets of SOD were planted around the Hole 3 Green and the Sand Trap was sculptured to regain a semblance of its original shape prior to the "Fox Family" building their Condo there. Dave, our Superintendent, was instrumental in the design and overall effort to finish up this year's SOD program. To wrap up a very successful year, the forms for the Ladies Tee on Hole 5 were built, sandy loom/topsoil, 27 tons, put in place and left to settle till next season. SOD will be placed on top and the Tee operational around opening day, March 1st.

The Hole-In-One Program wrapped up at the end of October, with two winners, Bob Jani and Jim Mort splitting the pot of \$700.00.

The last Scramble of 2022 was held on November 8th and the first Scramble in 2023 will be April 11th.

The last Board of Directors Meeting was held on December 13th and the minutes are posted to the LHS Web Site. The next Board meeting is scheduled for March 14th.

The next General Membership Meeting is scheduled for April 17, 2023. We need a quorum, plan on attending and participating in the operations of your golf course.

Shorrock Gardens hosted a luncheon for the LHCC and WGA members on December 15th. We presented Kelly McClosky, Steven Kosakowski and the Shorrock Gardens Staff a letter of appreciation for their support throughout 2022.

The Board of Directors voted to retain our membership and guest fees the same for 2023.





In the event of a severe storm prediction there are several things to do in advance that will prevent injuries and keep you safe:


- Make sure your cell phone is fully charged, invest in a car charger
- Invest in battery operated lights
- Have several flashlights with charged batteries handy, a solar power radio
- Medications refilled to avoid running out
- Supply of food that doesn't have to be heated (think PB&J)

If power is lost:

- Keep refridge/freezer doors closed food will stay cold
- Use battery operated lights instead of candles to eliminate fire risk
- Turn off/unplug TV's, computers, DVR's, power bars etc. to avoid a power surge when power comes back on
- Text OUT to 544487 (LIGHTS) to report an outage via text message. Text STAT to 544487 to receive an update for your reported outage. If you're not enrolled in text messaging, text REG to 544487 to get started.

Also, if you must drive, please clean off your car completely so you can drive safely and not be a hazard to others. 



Otherwise, you can be admitted to a nursing home, where the nursing home will take on the responsibility of your ADL's. The average cost of a nursing home in NJ is between \$11,000.00-\$13,000.00/month for a semi-private or private room. Either option is very expensive and can be offset by having long-term care insurance. Long Term care insurance will provide monthly payments to offset these costs and give you the freedom to choose between staying home or a nursing home.

70% of people currently turning 65 will spend some time using Long Term Care, with the average duration being 3 years. What's concerning is only 25% of people **think** they will at some point need this kind of intensive care. And most of us fail to realize Medicare does not cover nursing care after 100 days. There is a national mismatch between expectations and reality on the subject.

So what can you do? As you get older you should take inventory of the family near you. If you have an abundance of family close to your current location, you may not need as much in the way of Long-Term Care Insurance. In exchange, they put you on state Medicaid and pay for the nursing home. There is a 5-year look back on the spend-down to make sure you haven't hidden any assets.

In Spain, WHITE wine is always sipped for a NEW YEAR TOAST & the Swiss drop whipped CREAM on the floor FOR GOOD LUCK in the NEW YEAR!!

Here are some WHITE recipes to celebrate the NEW YEAR...!

Making Ricotta Cheese at home: Suggested by Margo Buttino Cherry Quay Brick! From the Ina Garten book of easy recipes!

Ingredients:

- 4 cups Whole milk
- 2 cups heavy cream
- 1 tsp kosher salt
- 3 tbsp white vinegar (Heinz)
- U will need cheesecloth

Directions:

- 1. Line a mesh strainer with cheesecloth
- 2. Pour heavy cream & milk into a stainless-steel pot. Bring to a full boil over med. heat & stir in salt.
- 3. Turn off heat stir in vinegar & let stand for 1 minute.
- NOTE: The mixture will separate into 2 parts> THICK (curds) & MILKY (whey).
- 4. Pour into cheesecloth & leave to drain for 20-25 mins. THE LONGER IT DRAINS, THE THICKER IT BECOMES!
- 5. Empty into a bowl & discard the cheesecloth. Use at once or cover the bowl with plastic & refrigerate!

Slow Cooker New England Clam Chowder (easy)...from Sue's family recipe book!

Ingredients:

- 1/2 bacon diced (or Canadian bacon for less fat)
- 3 cans chopped clams (not drained)
- 1 yellow onion (chopped fine)
- 4 potatoes peeled & diced (Yukon Gold recommended)
- 2 stalks of celery (diced fine)
- 2 cloves garlic minced (or 1/8 tsp garlic powder)
- 2 cups clam juice
- 1 tsp Kosher salt
- 1/4 tsp course black pepper
- 1/2 tsp thyme
- 2 cups heavy cream
- 2 tbsp all purpose flour

Directions:

- 1. Cook diced bacon in a skillet until crisp, remove & drain on paper towel. Save 1/2 in refrigerator for finishing the chowder at serving time.
- 2. Add to slow cooker> 1/2 bacon, clams, onion, potatoes, celery, garlic, Kosher salt, black pepper & thyme.
- 3. Cook on low for 7 hrs.
- 4. AFTER THE 7 HRS. In a measuring cup, mix heavy cream & flour together & add to the slow cooker. Cook on high for 30 minutes.
- 5. Serve with remaining bacon.

NOTES: The calories can be reduced by using: # Canadian Bacon instead of smoked bacon

H & H cream instead of heavy cream.

Snowball Cookies

Ingredients:

1 cup soft butter

1/2 cup powdered sugar (10X)

1 tsp vanilla

2 1/4 cups All purpose flour

3/4 cups chopped nuts (Walnuts or Almonds)

1/4 tsp salt

Additional powdered sugar for finishing

Directions:

- 1. Heat oven to 400*
- 2. Mix butter, 1/2 cup of powdered sugar & vanilla in a large bowl
- 3. Stir in flour, nuts & salt. Mix until the dough holds together.
- 4. Shape dough into 1" balls & place on cookie sheet 1" apart
- 5. Bake 10 12 minutes or until set; but not brown. Remove from sheet pan & cool slightly on wire rack.
- 7. Roll warm in powdered sugar. ROLL IN POWDERED SUGAR A SECOND TIME!

NOTES: The dough doesn't spread during baking, They are done when firm to the touch, they don't get brown, like shortbread.

PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2022-2023 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a physician script/note which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician.

Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.

The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

ALWAYS CALL **911 FOR ANY MEDICAL EMERGENCY**

Please be sure to keep on hand extra supplies of medications and food so that you do not need to leave the house during or immediately after a snowstorm. The weather predications generally provide ample warning time for making preparations.

Please respond as soon as possible as the winter season will be here soon.

Snowy Images

The cold weather makes it hard to get motivated to go outdoors and shoot, but there are some great photo opportunities to be had in winter.

Make certain you dress for the cold and watch for ice!

Even when there is no snow, icy ponds make great subjects. Look for ducks, geese, or seagulls standing on the ice. Ice also makes for great reflection images. Many normal scenes take on a new meaning in the cold of winter

After a snowfall, there are great shots everywhere. The challenge with snow shots is getting the proper exposure. A very bright snowy scene

tricks your camera into thinking there is too much light, so the camera will cut back on exposure. This makes the snow in your images look gray. If you know how to set your exposure compensation, increase the exposure by 1 stop to brighten the snow. If your camera has "scene" modes, use the one for snow or beach.

The bare leafless trees make nice silhouette shots and are very good for black and white photography. They are especially effective with a sunrise or sunset behind them.
